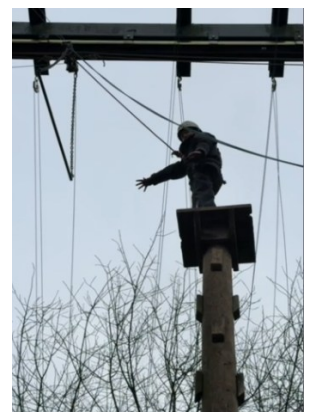
Welcome to our Spring Term edition.

The hardest part was surpassing your expectations. It was amazing!!!



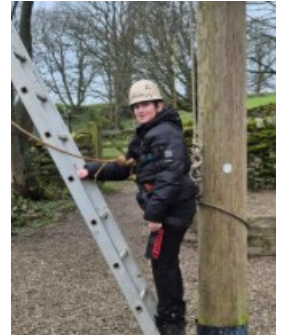
